You are the in-charge person for the University, and may be required to act as Incident Commander at any University emergency. After regular business hours, you are responsible for the entire university, its assets and personal safety of persons. The Sergeant is an integral part of the University's emergency response structure and may call upon other internal/ external resources for support.

You have:

- 5 years (current or previous) of Special Constable or Police Officer status, pursuant to the current Province of Ontario Police Services Act
- Previous municipal, provincial or federal policing experience, or equivalency
- Supervisor experience in an emergency response environment

Our preferred candidate will also have:

- Post-secondary education (University degree or College Diploma)
- Ontario Police College Basic Constable Training or recognized equivalent
- Police supervisory experience
